Degrees

TJP offers an Inter-Engineering Masters, Technical Japanese minor, and Certificate degrees.

Japan Internship

Graduate-level students (HCDE 601) and undergraduate students (HCDE 495) can earn 3 credits for a summer quarter internship, and up to 7 credits for longer internships.

Graduate Students

within the Jackson School of International Studies are eligible to enroll in the Technical Japanese Program. Courses are taught in sequence, and therefore students must enroll for fall quarter courses. Entering the program mid-year is not an option.

Students who have already achieved a high level of Japanese and are looking for the next step in their Japanese education may be eligible for the Technical Japanese Program. This is a two-year program originally designed for students in engineering and other sciences but open to select students across the UW campus including JSIS students. Course work is intended to be taken alongside regular courses in your major area of study.

Placement Test

To qualify for this program, students must pass a placement test. There are both written and oral components to the placement test. The written portion may be done remotely (with proctor present) and the oral portion may be done via Skype. Applicants are advised to take the test by May.
